

Hello! For those of you who don't know me, my name is Sam Wilson; I'm new to the BTRS team, having been appointed as a Patient Support Coordinator in the Spring. This role has been funded by a grant from Beefy's Charitable Foundation, so a big thank you to them. Lady Kathy Botham has been a longstanding ambassador of BTRS, and set up the foundation, along with her husband Sir Ian, to support key charities they have been involved with over their 30 years of fundraising. The money will make a huge difference to the support that BTRS is able to offer brain tumour patients in Yorkshire.

My previous job was as a clinical nurse specialist in Adult Neuro Oncology, working

with the teams at St James's and Leeds General Infirmary. I'm really excited to be working for BTRS and over the coming months I look forward to catching up with everyone, as well as meeting people new to the charity and the support group.

There are several ways in which I can help or advise you. You might want to telephone me or email me for some advice or support. Some of you already come along to our monthly support group which is held on the first Thursday of every month in Leeds (please contact me for more details on sam@btrs.org.uk and 07539 457239). If you have never been before, it's a good opportunity to meet me as well as other

patients and relatives who are in a similar situation to you.

If a patient is struggling financially I can help with a referral for a BTRS grant. Referrals can be made either by a patient, relative or health professional. Another area that I can offer advice around is counselling. Through BTRS I can signpost you and your family to a professional counsellor local to you.

Over the coming months there will be further projects that I will be developing to help support patients, relatives and friends throughout Yorkshire and the Humber. I will update you in the next newsletter.
